# Role of the **Board President**

- \* Bylaw 9323: "The Board president shall conduct Board meetings in accordance with Board Bylaws and procedures that enable the Board to efficiently consider issues and carry out the will of the majority."
- \* The Board President shall have the same rights as other members of the Board, including the right to move, second, discuss and vote on all questions before the Board
- \* The Board President is in charge of applying the rules of conduct of the meeting
- \* The Board President should preside with impartiality















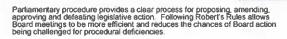




# Robert's Rules of Order

Manual on parliamentary procedure, with three main goals:

- Orderly conduct of meetings
- Increased public participation and deliberation
- 3 Facilitation of decision making





- . Board President must call the meeting to order at the scheduled
  - "It is [time] and I will now call the [date] meeting of the Rosemead School District Board of Trustees."
- \* Board President then asks the Superintendent (Board Secretary)
- Superintendent shall then call roll by reading out each Trustee's name, each Trustee must indicate their presence when their name is read out.
- · Board President shall then move to the first order of business approval of the agenda for the meeting – and ask for a motion and a second.

### **Basic Rules**

- · Only one subject or item may be before the Board
- · Each item presented for consideration is entitled to full and free debate
- Only one person may speak at any given time
- \* All Trustees have equal rights

# Approval of the Agenda

- · Board President Is there a motion to approve tonight's agenda?
- · Trustee A. I move to approve the agenda.
- · Board President: Is there a second?
- Trustee B: I second the motion.
- · Board President: There is a motion to approve the agenda for tonight's Board meeting, [date], from Trustee A and seconded by Trustee B. All those in favor, say "aye."
- \* Trustees in favor say "aye."
- Board President: All those opposed say "nay."
- \* Trustees opposed say "nay."
- Board President The motion to approve tonight's agenda





- · Before recessing to closed session, the Board President reads the agenda items on the closed session portion of the agenda and asks for public comments on the closed session items.
- After public comment, or if no public comment is received, the Board President shall recess the meeting to closed session "At this time, the Board will go into closed session."
- \* Only necessary parties for each closed session item may be present in the closed session room:

**Public Comment** During the public comment period, the public has an opportunity to address the Board on items of public interest within the Board's Board members or staff may briefly respond to staff ments or questions from members of the public, but may I/OT engage in a back-and-forth discussion of topics not on the agenda.

After closed session, the **Board President** shall:

- Report out any action taken in closed session by item.

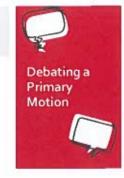


Action Items and Motions The Board President will read out the agendalitem and then ask, "Is there a motion?" Any member can then make the motion by saying "I move to approve..." or "I move to..." The Board President must re-state the motion and invite debate by asking: "It is moved and seconded that.... Is there any discussion?"

### **Trustee Communications**

- · Trustees use this time to make announcements or reports related to their own activities within the District's jurisdiction.
- · Topics may include: community events or programs, holidays, remarks regarding school events/successes, commendations for staff, Board activities
- Comments should be brief and limited to about five minutes. although there is no exact time limit prescribed in the Board Bylaws.



- After a motion is made and seconded, the Board President shall ask if there is any discussion.
- The Board President generally should recognize Trustees to speak in the following order:

  Trustee who made the motion,

  - 2 Any other Trustee who wishes to speak.
- The debate must be confined to the merits of the subject item.
- Debate can be closed by any Trustee in the following ways:

   Postponing consideration → any matter may be postponed by a motion to postpone ("I move that we postpone this matter until ...") and a second
  - Ending the debate  $\Rightarrow$  any debate may be ended by a motion to take a vote on the issue ("I call for a vote" or "I call the question") and a second
- If there is no debate or the discussion ends, the Board President shall call for a vote. A vote is called by first asking all those in favor to say "aye," then asking all those opposed to say "nay."
   Each member's vote must be recorded in the minutes.

# Types and Order of Motions

While a primary motion is pending, the following motions and points can be made

- 1) Motion to adjourn ("I move that we adjourn") to end the meeting
- ) Motion to recess ("I move that we recess for X minutes") to take a
- Point of <u>privilege</u> to make a statement regarding an issue affecting a single Trustee (request for assistance, request to open the window, directly respond to a comment defaming the Trustee's character)
- 4) Motion to <u>table</u> ("I move that we table the present motion") -- to set aside the pending motion to take up something more urgent, with expectation of returning to original motion
- 5) Motion to end debate and vote ("I call the question")
- Motion to postpone ("I move that we postpone this matter until...")
- Motion to <u>amend</u> current motion (\*I move that this motion be amended by...")

A member may not interrupt the speaker to make any of the above motions, but CAN interrupt the speaker to make a point of privilege. All motions must be seconded, except for a point of privilege.



# Other Requests and Motions

- · Point of order: if the meeting is not following parliamentary procedure or rules, a Trustee may make a "point of order.
- Point of information: when a Trustee has a question, or wants more information about the facts under discussion, they may make a "point of information."
- Call for <u>vote count</u> to verify voice vote: before a new motion is brought, any Trustee may ask for a vote by count to verify voice count ("ayes" and "nays").
- Motion to take up matter previously tabled: to return to a matter previously tabled, a Trustee may say, "I move we take from the table." and the President must ask for a second.
- Motion to withdraw: after a motion is made and discussed, the Trustee making the motion may withdraw it by saying, "I ask permission to withdraw my motion."



- Board Bylaw 9323 when no conflict of interest requires abstention, its members have a duty to vote on issues before them.
- · Conflicts of interest requiring a Trustee's abstention:
  - Political Reform Act: a Board decision that will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect on the Trustee, the Trustee's immediate family, or the Trustee's economic interests.

    - If a conflict under the PRA exists, the conflicted Trustee must abstain from voting and any participation in the decision-making process
       Examples moome from a business, streets in real property, investments, business employment or management, business-owned property, loans and girts
  - Government Code 100g: a Trustee who has a "remote" interest in a contract before the Board must disclose the interest to the Board a abstain from voting, and the interest must be noted in the meeting
  - Examples officers or employees of a nonprof 4 minut, earnings of minimization to the for personal services, landford or remain of contracting pairs (Common law conflicts: where a conflict exists (or appears to exist) between a Trustee's official and personal interests, the Trustee must abstain from participating in the Board decision.



- What happens if a motion is not seconded? If the President asks for a second on the pending motion and hears none, the motion dies. The President should state that no second has been made: "Hearing no second, the motion fails." The Board should NOT discuss a state with the second hours. discuss or debate a motion without a second.
- What happens if only three Trustees are present at a Board
- meeting and one Trustee must abstain from a vote?

  The Board may act only by majority vote of all of the membership constituting the Board. (Education Code section 3;546 | Actordingly, no act may be taken unless at least three members of the Board are present.
  - If one Trustee must abstain due to a legal conflict of interest, there is no quorum for action on the issue, and the Board may not act.
- If one Trustee abstains for reasons other than a legal conflict of interest, the abstention shall be counted for purposes of determining whether a majority of the membership of the Billard has taken attion.



- \* "Emergency circumstance:" a physical or family medical emergency that prevents a member from attending in person
- + Remote participation due to an emergency circumstance must be requested by the member and approved by the legislative body at
- \* Legislative body shall request a general description of the circumstances relating to their need to appear remotely.
- + General description need not exceed 20 words and shall not require the member to disclose any medical diagnosis or disability, or any personal medical information that is already exempt under

- + Allows Trustees to participate in a meeting remotely without disclosing or providing access to their non-public teleconference location under certain specific requirements.
- The need must be for "just cause" or an "emergency
- At least a guorum of the members of the Board must participate in person from a singular physical location identified on the agenda, which must be open to the public and within the boundaries of the
- A request made for remote participation may be considered by the Board without placement on the agenda if the request is made without sufficient time permitting placement on the agenda.
- The remotely participating Trustee must publicly disclose whether any individuals over the age of 18 are present in the room at the remote location and the general nature of their relationship.



- The Trustee appearing remotely must participate through both audio and visual technology
- If there is a disruption during the meeting preventing broadcast, no action may be taken until public access is restored
- \* The Board must provide access to the meeting for the public to hear and observe the meeting, and remotely address the Board by either:
  - A two-way audiovisual platform, or
  - A two-way telephonic service and live webcast of the meeting
- A Trustee cannot use these procedures for a period of more than three consecutive months or 20% of the regular meetings within a calendar year.
- \* Teleconferencing rules under AB 2449 will expire on January 1,

The Rosement School District provides the most economical, environmentally sustainable, and appropriate transportation services.

The Rosemead School District provides transportation by means of a joint powers agreement call MERGE (El Monte Union High School, El Monte City School District, Mountain View School District, and Rosemead School District)





#### Low Income Eligibility, Homeless and Foster Youth

The Board shall establish financial sesistance requirements which shall be reviewed and adjusted periodically to meet the needs of the District (BP 3540)

Within the scope of services offered, and in accordance with lew, Board policy and administrative regulation, nomeless students and youth in ternation, where transportation is a barrier to accessing their educational services, shall be provided transportation on school buses, municipal buses, or structly allowed transportation envice providers, at no cost to this student.

### Special Education Students

No charge shall be made for any transportation of students whose individualized education program requires transportation or whose perental/quardiens are determined indigent pursuant to administrative regulations. (3P 3540)

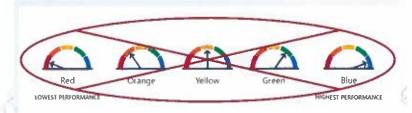
