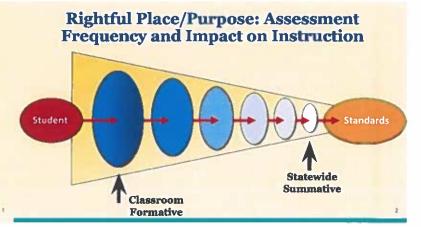

- COVID-19 pandemic considerations on unfinished learning

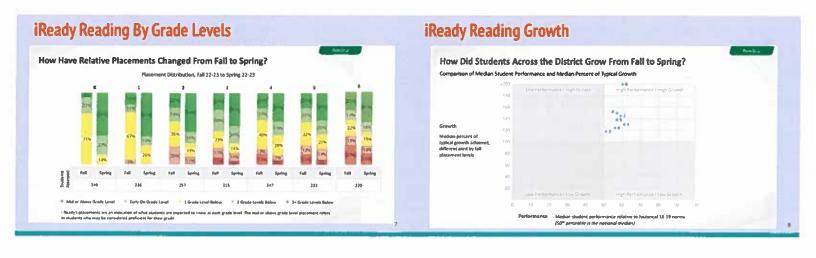
Using Summative Results

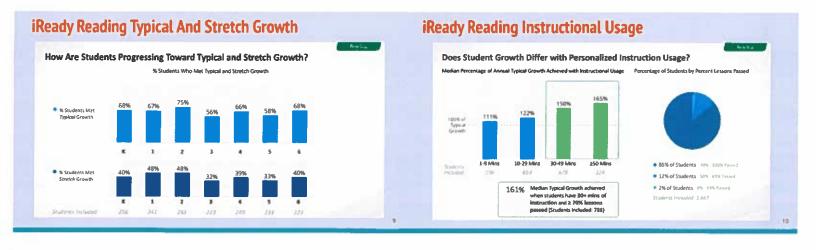
- · Comprehensive, complex, and difficult process

 - -Patience

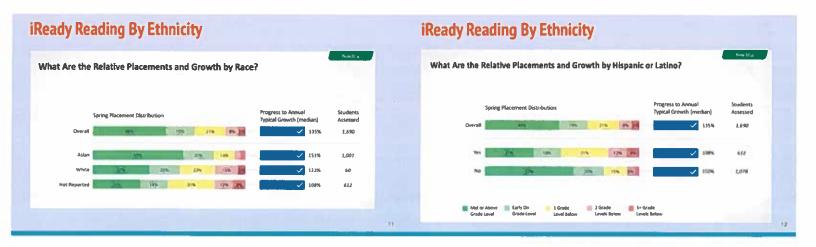
